Can you tell us any personal stories to highlight the value of the project?	We have not received any personal stories of patients that are benefitting from the equipment we are able to donate. However, the hospital personnel have demonstrated an urgent need for better, newer and higher quantities of equipment. Hospitals across Sri Lanka benefit from highly trained medical professionals, but they are limited by a lack of resources and equipment that could greatly improve chances of recovery and prevent life changing injuries. The hospitals we have donated to have expressed immense gratitude for our donations.
