	- Free healthy lunches - we handed out over 1000 free meals in summer 2022
	Our Wales trip particularly stands out for us, it was the first time we were able to provide a residential trip which was an amazing experience, not just for some of the young people who use the centre but also for a variety of different children which we had never met before. We liaised with local schools and the pupil referral unit asking them to refer some children that may have never been away from the family home, or they may have been young carers needing a rest bite. The trip was very successful and each child came away having achieved something they never thought would be possible.
	If I was given a pound for every time we heard 'I can't do this' I would have enough to book the trip again.
	Fingers crossed in the future we can organise another similar trip.
	We have now employed an office manger who has become an integral part of the team and is working on future funding applications as well as raising our profile. We are most definitely reaching out to more families further a field, we have new volunteers which include staff with visible disabilities.
	We have two new toddler classes running and 2 new performing art classes, we have 20 home schooled children attending woodwork sessions in our newly refurbished workshop. We have a bike maintenance club which teaches young people how to maintain and care for their bikes, the bikes are donated from

	Here goes, moving to Barrowcliff we were all nervous. Our grandson came into our care at the age of 3. He is being screened for ADHD and Autism. You can imagine how hard this is for us all. I decided to follow Gallows close centre on Facebook to see what was on offer. I saw a post for a football club which was on Saturdays. Anxious, I gave them an email. The response was lovely and we decided to take our grandson along. My stomach was churning, not knowing how Bailey would react.
	From the second we met the staff we were greeted with a smile and such a calming approach, I thought why I was anxious.
	From then on Bailey's confidence has blossomed. I became a volunteer myself for the centre. Bailey will walk with the staff and friends he has made to the beach, woods and anywhere they go. I myself can't walk that far sometimes.
	Bailey was offered a place on the residential trip to Wales. As we are Bailey's guardians and a volunteer I was able to join the trip as Bailey needed some additional needs support and otherwise would not have been able to go, then my husband became a volunteer too, he himself is suffering from depression. Plus, other things, he was then asked to go to Wales, how excited were we.
	To see all the children from the Barrowcliff community achieve what they did was truly amazing. The staff, volunteers and children are a huge family to us. Not sure where we would be if it wasn't for them. Every member is a huge credit to Barrowcliff.
