Can you describe and/or demonstrate the specific impact that TFN funding has had against your initial objectives?	<p>One of our priorities for the 2017/18 year was to extend our service into the East Riding. We have now achieved this and the East Riding Manager is in post. In the past 12 months, we have worked with 14 different schools in the East Riding and over 1000 children against an original target of 240. The response and engagement in the East Riding has been phenomenal and schools have completely engaged with the programme. In addition, we have secured support from 12 local businesses that have either donated cash or in kind support to help us develop the programme and support local children.</p> <p>East Riding of Yorkshire Council have taken a very positive view of the programme and are keen to maintain the East Riding Children's University long term and they have committed £15,000 to support the East Riding Managers post. We continue to fundraise for this programme and are now planning activities in the East Riding for the next 12 months.</p>
