	- Deliver a respite trip for 12 of our beneficiaries/sisters to increase their resilience and mental well-being levels. This was a week-long trip to Cornwall which took place in August 2021. During this trip we have undertaken community building activities and organised activities such as surfing, beach trip, arts, movie night, evening campfire and board games to raise their well-being. Many of these young women have never left London before and have never seen the sea or made a campfire. It has given them the opportunity to make amazing memories and experience new things. The funding has enabled us to provide sustenance, sanitary products, and accommodation to our sisstars throughout the trip.
	- Allocate 3 team members to the respite trip that were involved in organising activities, dealing with safeguarding and ensuring the positive outcomes of the trip.
	-We launched the Empowerment Fund from the BFN funding which has enabled some of our sis-stars to buy basic items for themselves or their homes when transitioning to independent living. This has enabled our sisters

The trust of the BFN has also given more confidence for future donors to contribute to our unrestricted funds such as Lloyds, Garfield Weston and various corporate donations. Throughout the past year we have been able to receive unrestricted grants totalling £165,000 to be spent over the next two years, which has enabled us to support organisational costs such as staffing and infrastructure.

It has enabled us to make connections with corporate volunteers and donors such as our new relationship with Credit Suisse, whose employees have joined our work coaching network for our programmes and have generously donated to our 2021 programmes' graduation ceremony.
