Can you describe and/or demonstrate the specific impact that TFN funding has had against your initial objectives?	We were able to run the two projects as expected, involving a group of remote volunteers and sixty children aged 10-11 at Mandeville Primary School. The volunteers made puppets and painted sets for two puppet shows, which the children then used to perform. As well as some volunteers improving on existing skills, we were able to grow our volunteer group through this project. The children also developed new performance skills as well as teamwork, communication, confidence and resilience - very important given the impact of COVID and lockdowns on their development.
	The two shows were livestreamed to the rest of the school and for parents, and to date have had almost 600 individual views on YouTube (though multiple people watched some together e.g. a whole class watching one screen counted as one view).
	We have since been able to build on this work to run more local intergenerational projects, expand our volunteer group further and find new activities for them, as well as deepening our partnership with Mandeville Primary School. In May 2022, we finished a further 2 projects with the school which culminated in spectacular sold-out performances at St Albans Abbey. Mandeville have also asked us back for 2023 to work with their next cohort of children.
